

I went out on Saturday



This game is played best with six or more players.

Stand in a circle.

Someone begins the game by saying:

I went out on Saturday.

The rest of the group then responds with:

Tell me, tell me, where did you go?

The first player chooses another child in the circle who has to decide where you went on Saturday (a football match, the zoo, a shop, the beach).

The rest of the group now asks:

Tell me, tell me, what did you see?

The first player now names as many people, objects and animals that can be thought of that might have been seen at the venue.

When you have run out of ideas, start the action again with different players.



- Add another dimension to this game by allowing children to see if they can slip in something impossible – a lion at the shops, for instance. They earn a point if nobody notices.
- Extend the range of the game by using other senses. For example, *What did you hear?*
